Paul on the best part of working in Kenya ...

"People – they are full of faith and friendliness."

Paul on the hardest part of working in Kenya ...

"Poverty – it's systemic."

Paul on what life is like in Kenya ...

"The country is beautiful, diverse, and compact. Within a few hours' drive, there are rain forests, deserts, tropical beaches, snow-capped mountains, the great Rift Valley, highlands with tea and coffee, lowlands with sugarcane and sisal, remote hut-littered villages, and modern skyscraper-strewn cities (okay, just one of those – Nairobi). Kenya boasts the largest number of bird and animal varieties in the world. The local traditional food is bland (lots of maize meal), but anything western and imported is available (at a price) and so is spicy/tasty Ethiopian food (our kids' favorite). No one living here who has lived in Canada is allowed to complain about the weather – except for the droughts. Nairobi especially is a climatic paradise. By and large, the people here have experienced more suffering, faith, and joy than most people in Canada ever have."

"A full vehicle of assorted passengers is the norm when travelling between Garissa and Dadaab. Another constant is wildlife. Thankfully I haven't been in Africa long enough to cease being fascinated by its fauna. So, I apologize to my usually hurried companions for stopping and staring at ostrich, gerenuk, kudu, giraffe, cheetah, hyena, and baboon. Extra apologies are required for delays caused by the more common tiny dikdik and 'unclean' warthogs. But hey, it doesn't take long - and love for creation is part of love for God and of our testimony."

Paul on how we can help serve missionaries like themselves ...

"No pity, lots of prayer, and money (of course), especially if it is accompanied by an interest to learn and even participate with us. Many churches serve us and the people here, but we most enjoy churches that allow us and the people here to serve them – helping them in missional living, locally and globally."
