CBM on Bill & Janice's ministry in Indonesia ...

"Since arriving in Indonesia, Bill has been director of the master's program at the Kalimantan Theological Seminary. He has taught 14 courses in the areas of counselling, Bible, leadership, missions, languages, etc. He has also been involved in church planting in the interior of Kalimantan. Janice has been heavily involved in music ministry in the local church and in the seminary."

Janice on the best part of ministering in Indonesia ...

"Just being able to teach and mentor students as they train to be pastors, the friends we have made among the national staff at the seminary, and seeing the students out in their places of ministry once they graduate."

Janice on the hardest part of ministering in Indonesia ...

"Right now, being separated from our children, Jonathan and Marigan."

Janice on life in Indonesia ...

"Indonesia is a very diverse country because it is made up of many islands. There are many people groups, each with their own languages, foods, and cultures. Most of the staff at STK are from Northern Sulawesi (part of the Spice Islands) so their foods are very spicy. The Dayak students from West Kalimantan are used to bland foods and have to get used to the very spicy foods that other tribal groups here like. Rice is the staple food. There is a saying in Indonesian: If you haven't eaten rice yet, you haven't eaten."

"We live about 5 km south of the equator, and Pontianak is about 10 km from the coast and about 2 feet above sea level. So it is hot and humid all year round. The temperature year round is between 24C and 34C, with humidity rating between 70 and 95%."

Janice on how we can help ...

"Pray for us and for our children who are both back in Canada studying right now. Give toward our team support so that we can keep working on the field."

Chad's Story ...



BEFORE

I was born to two loving parents, but when I was 4 they divorced. Mom really tried to be there for us, but I kept all my hurt and anger inside. I struggled in school and got in trouble a lot.

By Gr. 6, I was smoking and by 15, I was a full-blown alcoholic, drug user and dealer. At 18, I injected morphine and was hooked.

Some good friends took care of me at my lowest and eventually I came off the morphine, but I jumped right back into the bottle and street drugs. Even the death of my best friend who was killed drinking and driving didn't stop my addiction.



AFTER

His girlfriend was starting to change and I found out she was getting help from a church. I now know that she was also praying for me and my salvation. She was always there for me. Over time, we became close.

She introduced me to some wonderful people who wanted to show me a different way. That night I accepted Christ and I started to change. There were days when I didn't want to get high or drunk. I was baptized in 2007. The guest speaker at the service shared about Teen Challenge and what the Lord had done in him.

I entered the program but left after 6 weeks. I also left God behind. It took a serious eye injury to bring me back to Him and Teen Challenge. Since then, the Lord is growing me spiritually through my trials. He has never left me nor forsaken me. He showed me love when I needed it the most. I thank Him every day for the changes He has made in me!
